

SMALL GROUP INQUIRY QUESTIONS

A List of Questions for Conversation, Discipleship, and Small Groups

SPIRITUAL INQUIRY

General: What were your highs and lows spiritually this week? On a scale of 1-10, how in tune do you feel with God this week? What's going on in your soul? What do you sense God is doing in you? (What are you longing for God to do in you?)

Prayer: What have you been praying about this week? What do you find hard about praying?

Thanksgiving: What is something we can celebrate that God did in your life this week?

Threat: What is the biggest threat to your oneness with Christ? Where are you most vulnerable to sin? What sins are you battling? What do you do to remain humble in your relationship with God? What is something you regret from this week?

Holy Spirit: How is the Holy Spirit leading you to respond to him? Where do you need to submit and obey? What is the Holy Spirit leading you into?

Rest: Did anyone practice Sabbath this week (unplugged, no work, rest and play, etc.)? How did it affect your week? Why is this so hard to do?

Learning: What have you been reading this week? What is God teaching you? What biblical truth has been challenging or bothering you lately? How is that playing out in your life?

Missional Leadership: What do you sense God is doing around you? (What are you longing for God to do around you?) What do you consider to be the strengths in your leadership? What skills would you most like to grow in? What needs to change in your character? What opportunities for mission do you see before you? In what ways are you making disciples?

Marriage: How are you and your spouse doing? Are you growing in oneness? What is it looking like for you to partner in mission together? Are there new strains on your relationship that have surprised you? Has he/she complained about your time together recently?

Parenting: What is God teaching you about your role as a father/mother? How are you personally leading your family?

SERMON INQUIRY

General: What has God been teaching you on Sundays? What have you found challenging? What has stood out to you? What has been confusing? What questions have surfaced in your mind?

Specific: [Think back on the past Sunday and come up with one or two questions specifically related to the sermon.]
